



The Bachelor of Theology (BTh) is a 60 credit hour undergraduate program designed to equip students to interact with today's culture from an orthodox Christian theological perspective. Requirements to enter the ThB: an Associate degree or 60 semester credit hours (this requirement may be waived if the applicant is over 35 years old and demonstrates academic aptitude according to the American Council of Education's guidelines for issuing credit for prior learning). At least 30 credit hours must be completed at St. Andrews.

Graduates of this program will be able to:

- Display skills to teach theological concepts and their practical application to daily living.
- Show evidence of the ability to provide an effective apologetic of orthodox Christian doctrine.
- Demonstrate biblically-informed leadership skills for service in the church.
