



The Master of Theological Studies (MTS) is a 42 credit hour graduate program designed to equip students to interact with today's culture from an orthodox Christian theological perspective. Requirements to enter the MTS: a Bachelor's degree from a recognized institution. At least 30 credit hours must be completed at St. Andrews.

Graduates of this program will be able to:

- Display skills to teach theological concepts and their practical application to daily living.
- Show evidence of the ability to provide an effective apologetic of orthodox Christian doctrine.
- Demonstrate biblically-informed leadership skills for service in the church.
